REGISTRATION & COST:

Registration and full payment are due by May 1

A minimum non-refundable payment fee of **\$100** must accompany registrations from each family.

***NOTE:** If a full payment is postmarked by May 1, receive a \$20 per person discount off the camp fee.

Campers will want to have extra spending money for the snack shop and camp craft store. The camp fee does include seven full days of camp, the Bible study manual, T-shirt, camp picture, camp awards (earned for finishing Bible manual, daily devotions, memory verses, and for team accomplishments), along with 20 meals and really “great” activities.

Campers can request one cabin-mate in the same gender/age/grade level. Every camper must have a tetanus inoculation.

QUALIFICATIONS:

FIRST YEAR CAMPERS:

Although this is not Awana camp, Campers must have achieved certain Awana qualifications to attend. Those who are entering 6th grade or higher and have earned an Awana Excellence, Timothy, Meritorious, or Citation Award and who meet the age requirements are eligible. Sixth grade through Junior High Campers must be at least 10 years old and High School Campers must be at least 13 years old by the first day of camp.

RETURNING CAMPERS:

Must complete the next Awana handbook/manual in the current handbook progression (For 2016 returning campers completing **6th grade**—T&T Ultimate Challenge Book 1 or 2 or Trek Check and Trek Bible Study One or Two; completing **7th or 8th Grade**—Trek Check and Trek Bible Study One or Two; or completing **9th grade through graduating Senior**—Faith Foundation (first year in Journey), Journey Suggested Bible Study (2015-2016 Study of Romans) plus one other of the Journey Bible Studies (second half of the year), required Bible reading, Service and Training.

GUEST QUALIFICATIONS:

Each qualified camper can invite one guest who meets the above age requirements and has completed the applicable Awana T&T Start Zone, Trek Check, or Faith Foundation. Campers can only attend camp one year as a guest. They can return if they meet the Returning Camper requirements.

ALL WORK MUST BE COMPLETED BEFORE CAMP. Campers must commit to the entire week (Saturday 3 PM to Saturday 9 AM).
