

QUALIFICATIONS:

AGE REQUIREMENTS:

All campers must meet the following age requirements: Sixth grade through Junior High Campers must be at least 10 years old and High School Campers must be at least 13 years old by the first day of camp.

There are three categories of eligible campers: **Honor Camper, Active Camper,** and **Guest Camper**.

HONOR CAMPER:

First year Honor Campers are those who have earned an Awana Excellence, Timothy, Meritorious, or Citation Award or two years of TruthSeekers, within the past two years, as verified by their local Awana Director. A returning Honor Camper must complete the next Awana handbook/manual in the current handbook progression. Honor Campers have earned and will receive special recognition throughout the week of camp.

ACTIVE CAMPER:

First year Active Campers are those who have not earned the Awana Awards to become an Honor Camper; however, they are actively registered in Awana through their local church or home school group, as verified by their local Awana Director. After their first year of camp, an Active Camper can advance to become an Honor Camper and are highly encouraged to by completing the next Awana handbook/manual in the current handbook progression. Otherwise they can return as an Active Camper as long as they remain actively registered in Awana.

GUEST CAMPER:

First year Guest Campers are those who are not actively registered in Awana but can complete, before camp, the Awana T&T Start Zone, Trek Check, or Faith Foundation (applicable for their age). Campers can only attend camp one year as a guest. They can advance and return as an Honor camper and are highly encouraged to by completing the next Awana handbook/manual in the current handbook progression. Otherwise they can return as an Active Camper if they become registered and active in Awana.
